Annual Improvement Priorities 2017

Every year as part of our planning processes schools develop an Annual Implementation Plan which outlines the improvement priorities for our school for the year ahead. This plan is not an exhaustive 'to do' list of everything that has to happen in the school that year. Rather it is a small focussed set of goals designed to have an impact on student learning outcomes.

This year our plan focusses on 2 target areas: both based in Literacy. These goals are centred around Communication (having a variety of devices/ systems to speak and communicate, other than with spoken words) and Comprehension (understanding what we read).

Data:

- ▣ Develop teacher and school leader expertise in communication systems analysis to inform effective teaching and learning.
- ▣ Implement and engage in regular, scheduled data discussions to inform Individual Curriculum Plans, guide teaching and prompt early intervention with comprehension.
- ▣ Identify and implement a relevant whole school tool for the collection and analysis of student well-being in relation to communication.
- ▣ Identify and implement a relevant school communication data collection tool- Communication matrix.
- ▣ Identify and implement a relevant school comprehension data collection tool- the BRI (Basic Reading Inventory) and ELB (Emergent Literacy Battery).

Currently, in 2017 we are undertaking a school review which will inform the development of our new 4-year plan. Keep a look out for this development.
